Code of Ethics

Members of ASLOR agree to abide by this common Code of Ethics.

1. a. The health and well-being of the client is of foremost importance to members.
 - b. Members should inform clients, as required, on the benefits of the Original 7 Level System of Reiki and explain that sessions are no guarantee of cure, nor are they a substitute for other medical or professional care or a replacement for a balanced, healthy life-style. Reiki is part of an integrated health program.
 - c. Members must encourage clients to take active responsibility for their own health.
 - d. Clients have a right to truth, confidentiality and respect for their dignity.
 - e. Clients have the right to refuse any form of treatment.
 - f. Members are prohibited from refusing a client on the basis of sex, age, race, religion, sexual orientation or political beliefs.
 - g. Members do have the right to refuse a client for reasons of personal safety or other reasons, provided the aforementioned clause is adhered to.
2. a. Members must refrain from diagnosis and prescription, unless professionally qualified.
 - b. Members are prohibited from suggesting that clients change prescribed treatment or from interfering with the treatment of a licensed health care provider.
 - c. Members must continually endeavour to improve their knowledge and professional skills to enhance their practice of Reiki.
 - d. Members must refrain from making negative remarks about other practitioners or other therapies, including conventional medicine.
3. a. Members who fail to abide by the terms and conditions of this code of ethics are subject to action by ASLOR, which may include, without being limited to, temporary or permanent suspension of membership, public notification of member's transgressions and/or legal action.
 - b. Members are responsible for reporting any ASLOR member who fails to respect this code of ethics, to protect the public interest and the good name and professional reputation of ASLOR.
 - c. Members acknowledge that this code of ethics is unable to cover every case of what is ethical and what is unethical. Therefore, it is understood that members must behave in accordance with the ethical standards of the state and nation in which they reside.
 - d. It is understood that ASLOR is hereby free from liability of any kind whatsoever for the actions or inactions of its members in fulfillment of their membership.
